The choir will be made up of some singers from the cathedral choir, the faculty of music at Western, and some participants of the Canadian Renaissance Music Summer School (which, in May, will also be at St. Paul's.)

Marmalade Update – The sale of our Famous St. Paul's Marmalade is now over for another year. We were not able to make as much marmalade this year as in the past as it has become very difficult to obtain the Seville Oranges. We were only able to buy 2 cartons of oranges this year and at a cost 30% higher than last year. In total about 400 jars were made and all the marmalade is now sold. The ladies who make the jam for our summer jam project have made marmalade from their own recipes using other citrus fruits. We now have a supply of orange/lemon marmalade, Meyer lemon marmalade and Clementine marmalade. The cost of these marmalades is \$5.00 for a 250 ml jar and \$3.00 for a 125 ml jar. There is also a supply of apple cider jelly at a cost of \$5.00 per jar. Please see us at coffee hour on Sundays to check out our available supply. Many thanks to all parishioners for their support, both with the making of the Seville Orange Marmalade and in purchasing the jams & marmalades. The 'Jam Ladies' intend to continue with the seasonal jam project as local fruits become available. Look for us in June starting with strawberry jam and continuing through to October with peach jam and crabapple jelly. We also encourage the return of our jars so that they can be refilled with summer jams. Again, thanks for the support of this worthwhile fundraising project.
