Collect for The First Sunday after the Epiphany page 123, 117

The Lesson is written in the 10th chapter of Acts beginning at the 34th verse. Peter began to speak to the Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name." **Here endeth the Lesson.**

The Holy Gospel is written in the 3rd chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Matthew beginning at the 13th verse. **Glory be to thee, O Lord.** Jesus Christ according to Matthew Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfil all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." **Praise be to thee, O Christ.**

Candlemas – Candlemas, celebrated on February 2, commemorates Jesus' first visit to the Temple in Jerusalem and is also known as the "Presentation of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple." It marks the fortieth day after Christmas and is the time of year when candles to be used in the church over the coming year are traditionally blessed.

St. Paul's Cathedral will be celebrating Candlemas this year by offering to members of the congregation tapers which have been blessed during the Eucharist. We hope that these candles will help us to remember, as Simeon said, that Christ is a "light for revelation to the Gentiles."


