The Epistle is written in the 1st chapter of Galatians beginning at the 11th verse. I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ. You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it. I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors. But when God, who had set me apart before I was born and called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with any human being, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were already apostles before me, but I went away at once into

Arabia, and afterwards I returned to Damascus. Then after three years I did go up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas and stayed with him fifteen days; but I did not see any other apostle except James the Lord's brother. In what I am writing to you, before God, I do not lie! Then I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia, and I was still unknown by sight to the churches of Judea that are in Christ; they only heard it said, "The one who formerly was persecuting us is now proclaiming the faith he once tried to destroy." And they glorified God because of me. **Here endeth the Epistle.**

The Holy Gospel is written in the 10th chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Matthew beginning at the 16th verse. **Glorify be to thee, O Lord.** Jesus said to the disciples, "See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. Beware of them, for they will hand you over to councils and flog you in their synagogues; and you will be dragged before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them and the Gentiles. When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say; for what you are to say will be given to you at that time; for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved." **Praise be to thee, O Christ.**

Marmalade – Many, many thanks to the small but mighty group of ladies and gentlemen who worked so hard making our famous St. Paul's Cathedral Seville Orange Marmalade during this past week. Without their help and the help of their volunteer friends this project just would not happen. Marmalade making has come to an end for this year and there is now a good supply of our famous marmalade for sale. About 550 jars were filled during this past week. Due to the increased cost of the oranges and jars we have raised our prices slightly. The cost of a 250 ml jar of regular marmalade is now \$6.00 with a case of 12 jars costing \$72.00. Marmalade with Scotch Whiskey costs \$7.00 for a 250 ml jar with a case of 12 jars costing \$84.00. There are a small number of 125 ml jars available costing \$3.00 each. We also have a limited number of 250 ml jars of Meyer Lemon Marmalade and Blood Orange Marmalade costing \$6.00 each. To purchase marmalade, please see Esther Moore at the jam table in Cronyn Hall at the coffee hour after the 10 am service on Sundays. Marmalade can also be purchased from Tim Skinner at the reception desk during the week.

Candlemas – Candlemas, celebrated on February 2, commemorates Jesus' first visit to the Temple in Jerusalem and is also known as the "Presentation of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple." It marks the fortieth day after Christmas and is the time of year when candles to be used in the church over the coming year are traditionally blessed.

St. Paul's Cathedral will be celebrating Candlemas this year by offering to members of the congregation tapers which have been blessed during the Eucharist. We hope that these candles will help us to remember, as Simeon said, that Christ is a "light for revelation to the Gentiles."


