Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – January 18 to 25 Please join us for an inter-faith service of worship on Wednesday, January 23 @ 7:30pm. We look forward to welcoming Christians from across the city, deepening ties of Christian kin-ship and enjoying a time of fellowship.

At least once a year, Christians are reminded of Jesus' prayer for his disciples that "they may be one so that the world may believe" (see John 17:21). Hearts are touched and Christians come together to pray for their unity, congregations and parishes all over the world exchange preachers or arrange special ecumenical celebrations and prayer services.

The event that touches off this special experience is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Traditionally, the week of prayer is celebrated between 18-25 January, between

the feasts of St Peter and St Paul. The theme for the week of prayer in 2019, "Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue ..." is inspired by Deuteronomy 16:18-20. This year, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has been prepared by Christians from Indonesia, who invite us to be a united witness, and an agent of Christ's healing grace in a broken world, by making specific commitments to justice, equality, and unity.
