Presider: Let us confess our faith, as we say,



People: **Amen.**


Great Thanksgiving




The Lord be with you. And also with you.

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, loving God, according to his command,

All: **we remember his death,
we proclaim his resurrection,
we await his coming in glory;**

Presider: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation;


by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

Patronal Festival Reception - Sunday, January 29th

Next Sunday, January 29th, we will celebrate the Patronal Festival of our Cathedral on the Feast of The Conversion of St Paul (a Holy Day in our Anglican Church's calendar).

Last year, your cathedral choir offered a wonderful luncheon following the morning service and, until our recent building issues, had arranged to do the same this year. However, given our sacred use of Cronyn Hall as our current worship space, the choir has reconsidered how best to mark the occasion.

What the choir would like to offer on that Sunday is a **Patronal Festival Reception**, that will take place in a decorated Fellowship Centre, and for those unable to manage the stairs, in the

Assembly Room and Guild Room. This will consist of wonderful, waiter-served hors d'oeuvres, wine, and soft drinks and will take place immediately after the morning service.

There will be no charge for this reception - it is entirely a contribution to the parish community from the choir - although opportunity will be provided for donations for those who wish to do so.

Please plan to stay after the morning service on Sunday, January 29th and join with our Cathedral Choir in fellowship and celebration of all that makes St Paul's Cathedral the vibrant family that we know it to be.

MARMALADE – Marmalade making will soon be upon us. About the middle of January the Seville oranges will arrive and for two weeks a lovely smell will waft through the halls of St. Paul's Cathedral as our famous St. Paul's marmalade is produced. Help from the ladies and gentlemen of our parish family will again be needed and sign-up sheets will appear on the notice board in the kitchen when the oranges have arrived. (Also look for a notice in the weekly bulletin). We are again reminding people that jars are needed and are asking that empty Mason type jars purchased in previous years be returned for refilling. (4 oz. jars (125 ml.) and 8 oz. jars (250 ml.) with rings but no caps please). We are also asking for donations of sugar (2 kg or 4 kg bags) as we were not able to purchase all we needed at a good price during the summer. - **Required** for those who missed the first Training Workshop or **had attended but are involved in more than one of the three ministries** and were only able to participate in the one training session, i.e someone who is a Lay Administrant and also an Intercessor but was only able to attend the Lay Administrants actual training.
